

Capital Area Teen Court Dress Code

Please dress respectfully and professionally for court nights. ***Teen Court does not expect volunteers to purchase items to meet a dress code need. This is to provide an idea of what is expected in court. We only ask that volunteers dress appropriately and within their means***

Example of what NOT to Wear:

- T-shirts or tank tops (including spaghetti straps unless covered by a cardigan)
- Jeans or shorts
- Sweatpants or leggings worn as pants
- Crop tops or short skirts/dresses (skirts/dresses must be close to knee-length)
- Hats or caps (head coverings are only allowed for religious reasons)
- Clothing with offensive words or images

Example of what TO Wear:

Tops:

- Button-up shirt, clean and pressed, tucked in
- Dress shirt or blouse, clean and pressed, untucked with a neat hem
- Dressy top or sweater
- Dress (knee-length or longer)

Optional Top Layers:

- Vest (only with a tucked-in shirt)
- Sport jacket or blazer
- Cardigan, sweater, or jacket

Bottoms:

- Dress pants or slacks
- Black skirt (no more than 1½ inches above the knee)

Socks/Hosiery:

- Socks with pants
- Tights, stockings, or socks (optional with skirts or dresses)
